When King Jesus arrives, he is:

1. anointed by the Spirit. (vv. 9-10)
2. affirmed by the Father. (v. 11)
3. attacked by the enemy. (vv.12-13)

BIG IDEA: The Father's love and the Spirit's presence enable Jesus and his followers to fight faithfully against the enemy.
